With rap, rock, jazz, alternative, heavy metal, classical and gospel

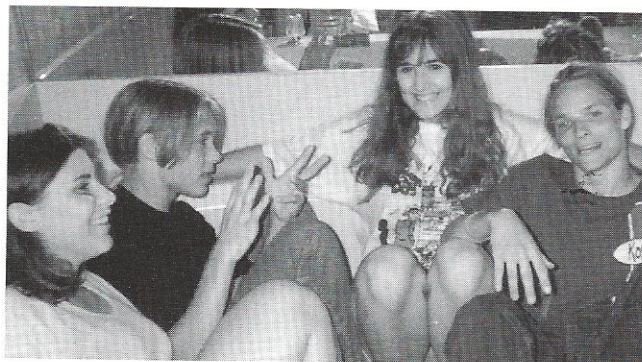
music, students enjoyed a broad spectrum of music. Sometimes becoming a close friend with someone exposed a student to new types of music.
