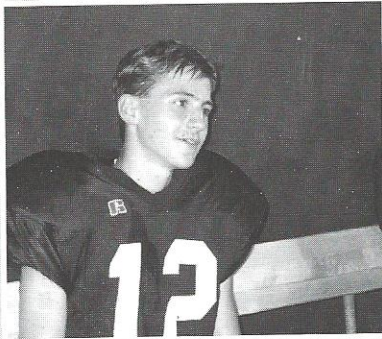

"We were ready to get the season started after having to practice all summer," sophomore **Taylor Smith** said.

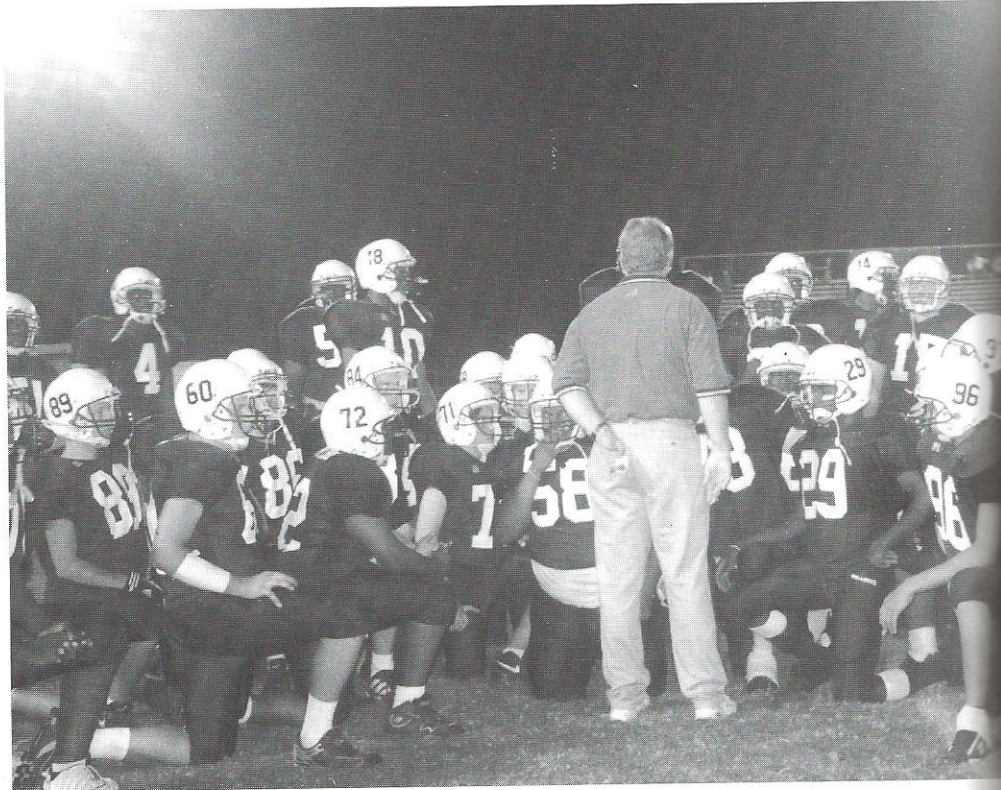
The schedule for the season matched the Bulldogs up with some strong competition, but with their team work and efforts they were able to overcome.
